- "commandments contained in ordinances"
 - Ephesians 2:15
- Law of Moses, Prophets, Psalms
 - **■** Luke 24:44

What is the Old Testament?

- More than Ten Commandments
 - Deuteronomy 27:26
- Christ brought "grace and truth"
 - **■** John 1:17

Whom Did the Old Testament Apply To?

- The Israelites
 - Malachi 4:4
 - Psalms 78:5
- To foreigners in Israel
 - Exodus 12:49
- Gentiles were exempt
 - Acts 14:16
 - Romans 2:14

Whom Did the Old Testament Apply To?

- Expectations of Gentiles
 - **■** Jonah 1:1-2
- Gentiles accountable to God
 - Romans 5:13
- Christ has universal authority
 - Matthew 28:18
 - Romans 1:16

When Did the Old Testament Apply?

- Book of Exodus
 - Deuteronomy 5:3
 - Galatians 3:19
- Foretelling a "New Covenant"
 - Jeremiah 31:31-34
- Until the time of reformation
 - Hebrews 9:9-10

When Did the Old Testament Apply?

- Christ's death ended it
 - Colossians 2:14
 - Hebrews 9:16-17
- Jesus will judge us
 - **■** John 12:48

Where Did the Old Testament Apply?

- Israelites everywhere
 - Daniel 6:10
- Jerusalem was central
 - Psalms 122
- Now applies everywhere
 - **■** John 4:20-23

How Did the Old Testament Apply?

- It applied strictly
 - Hebrews 10:26-31
- Intended for the house of Israel
 - Deuteronomy 6:4-9
- The need to teach
 - **■** John 6:45
 - Matthew 28:19-20

Why Did the Old Testament Apply?

- To foreshadow Christ's covenant
 - Colossians 2:16-17
- Identified sin the need for salvation in Christ could be identified
 - Galatians 3:19
 - Galatians 3:23-24
