Additional Revelation Given

- Commanded to provide a rest for man and animal
 - Exodus 23:12
- Must always be observed No excuses!
 - Exodus 34:21
- Even the building of the Tabernacle was put on hold while the Sabbath was observed
 - Exodus 31:12-17; 35:1-3

Punishment of the Sabbath Breaker

- The man who violated the Sabbath was to be punished by death!
 - Exodus 31:15
- He was stoned by the whole congregation!
 - Numbers 15:36
- Why such severe punishment?
 - Sabbath breaker showed a willful disregard for the Sabbath day and for God

New Testament Parallels

- Lord's Supper instituted
 - Matthew 26:28
- Jesus' death on our behalf
 - 1 Corinthians 11:24
- Lord's Supper observed every week
 - Acts 20:7
- Collection completed weekly
 - 1 Corinthians 16:1-2
- Assembling to worship God
 - Hebrews 10:25-29; Matthew 26:24

TEN COMMANDMENTS


- 1. You shall have no other gods before me.
