The Renewing of Our Mind

Introduction

Romans 12:1-2

- 1. Our quality of life is determined by the quality of our thinking.
- 2. We can make drastic changes in our life simply by changing our minds.
- 3. The truth of God's word is the most powerful source we have for positive change in the world.
 - A. However one must choose to be influenced by it.
- 4. Christians are described as those "who were once enlightened." Hebrews 6:4-6
- 5. But even after obeying the gospel, we are challenged to "renew" our mind continually.

Conformed Versus Transformed

- 1. If a Christian does not study, basically doing nothing, then one will gradually be "conformed" to the world.
 - A. Being "transformed" requires a conscious effort on our part (action), that produces a change within us.
- 2. It is a fact that conformity to the world is the course of least resistance.
 - 1 Corinthians 15:33
- 3. Many Christians today are probably more conformed to the world than we may realize or perhaps are willing to admit.
- 4. It is very important that every Christian set a goal of transformation to the Lord's way of thinking in all aspects of life.

Transformation is the Result of A "Renewed" Mind

- 1. In order for a Christian to truly live godly in this world, there must be an inward change of heart.
- 2. The "mind" = intellect + emotions + will.
 - A. Each one of these must be placed under the influence of the truth of God's Word His will for us.
- 3. "Spirituality" Spiritual mindedness (as opposed to carnal mindedness) has to be our ultimate goal.

Romans 8:5-11 Ephesians 4:17-24 1 John 2:15-17

- 4. A true Christian no longer views things and appraises them "according to the flesh"
 - 2 Corinthians 5:16

The Result

- "PROVING" what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God
- 1. To "prove" is to scrutinize or test to see if something is genuine; to judge worthy.
- 2. A carnal-minded person is a poor judge between right and wrong actions.

Ephesians 5:8-10,17

- B. As an analogy, consider an individual who dislikes baseball trying to judge the better of two baseball teams.
- 3. A person who has been "transformed" by the renewing of the mind is not only better able to discern God's will, but can also properly appraise the excellence of it.

Romans 2:18-20

Philippians 1:10 that you may approve the things that are excellent, that you may be sincere and without offense till the day of Christ,

4. The person with a "renewed" mind learns a lot by actual experience in the daily living of God's truth.

1 Peter 2:2-3

5. The Christian's life is a demonstration of the truth. Proof that God's truth "works" in their daily life!

Conclusion

- 1. The renewal of the Christian's mind is a continual, daily process.
- 2. Transformation is not an easy process.
 - A. The more we allow the world to be ingrained in us, the more difficult it will be to change.
 - 1) To stay in our own "comfort zone" is to be lost.
- 3. What we are truly after is to have the "mind of Christ."
